MONDAY 22 SEPTEMBER

Seth Lakeman – Seth returns to Nettlebed again to start our Autumn season of shows. He was nominated for the Mercury Music Prize in 2005 for 'Kitty Jay'. Multiple albums, tours and high-profile collaborations later, this acclaimed folk artist released his latest studio album The Granite Way in February on his own label, Honour Oak Records. It's a collection of songs staying true to his roots and referring to ancient stories that inspired early West Country storytelling. Seth says: 'Each song feels strongly connected through history to the moors and the sea'. In recent years Seth was asked to record on Van Morrison's album 'Moving On Skiffle' and he also previously worked, and toured extensively, with Robert Plant. We are also pleased to announce that **Benji Kirkpatrick** will be joining **Seth** on stage and that **Steve Knightley** is doing a support spot on this evening.

MONDAY 6 OCTOBER

John Tams – John's work has spanned six decades in every performance medium. His performance backstory includes *Muckram Wakes*, *The Albion Band*, *Home Service* and his duo with *Barry Coope*.

John is a recognised authority on vernacular music – a seven times winner at the BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards. At the National Theatre, he has worked as actor and musical director/composer on over 30 productions, including Lark Rise to Candleford. He played Daniel Hagman in the TV series Sharpe, for which he was script associate, cowriting the score. For radio, he was executive music director of the **Radio Ballads**, winning Gold at the Sony Radio Academy Awards. As an original member of the creative team that brought War Horse to the stage, John has since toured the world as a production executive. His performance of Only Remembered before the late Queen Elizabeth at The Festival of Remembrance has been viewed by over 70 million viewers worldwide. John has made over 60 albums, and continues to tour festival and concert stages.
